

Chair's Letter February 2024

Another day, another Democrat trampling our civil rights. In a recent hearing at the Roundhouse, I observed that audience members were given no microphone, and only one minute each to speak, both for and against the anti-gun legislation at hand. Some of our Representatives don't really seem interested in hearing the opinions of the public. It's almost like they already have their minds made up.

Santa Fe County Reps Reena Szczepanski and Andrea Romero seemed to be the ring leaders for the unconstitutional rights violations. In New Mexico where hunting is so popular, how did we end up with such anti-gun leaders? Did we the people choose these representatives with full awareness and understanding?
